#### WHY YOU SHOULD BE HONEST WITH GOD

Acts 4:36 - 5:11

## GOD KNOWS YOUR MOTIVES and ACTIONS. Acts 4:32-37; 5:1-2

Many believers gave with good and godly motives. Certain people, like Barnabas, had sold lands and houses and had given the proceeds to meet the needs of believers. Such generous giving gained the favorable attention of men. Many had sacrificially given because of their love for God and because of their love for other believers. Such motives honor God. Ananias and Sapphira evidently wanted the praise of people. They sold property and claimed that they had given all of the proceeds when they had only given a part. Their motive for giving was unholy and they lied when they gave. Make sure that your motives and actions honor God.

# **GOD CAN'T BE FOOLED. Acts 5:1-4**

- God knew that Ananias and Sapphira sold property and pretended to give all the proceeds to the church.
- God, who can't be fooled, revealed their lies to all.
- You can't hide anything from God either.

### **GOD TAKES SIN SERIOUSLY. Acts 5:5-11**

God took Ananias' dishonesty so seriously that He took Ananias' life.

God also took Sapphira's lying so seriously that He took her life.

"...You have not just lied unto men, but unto God." V. 4 Don't forget that God also takes your sin seriously. If you have sinned, confess it to God and stop committing that sin. What happened to Ananias and Sapphira should have the same sobering effect on you that it had on the believers in Jerusalem.

- 7. How did other believers respond to what had happened to Ananias and Sapphira? v. 5, 11 How do you think that these events affected the behavior of other believers in the future? How should this story affect you?
