WHY STUFF IS NOT ENOUGH Psalm 49

- 1. Wisdom and the Word tell you so. v. 1-4**
 - All people, no matter what their status in life, need to listen to the wisdom that comes through God's word.
 - God's wisdom helps you to see money and things in the proper perspective.
- 2. Wealth can't provide your greatest needs. v. 5-9**
 - Wealth cannot free a person from wickedness.
 - No amount of money can buy eternal life.
- 3. Wealth is always left behind. v. 10-12**
 - Sooner or later others will get all your stuff.
 - Many act like they are never going to leave this life.
 - It is extremely sad when a person leaves this earthly life without eternal life being their valued possession.
- 4. Wealth can't substitute for a relationship with God. v. 13-15**

At the end of life, the only thing that will matter is if you have salvation through Jesus Christ. Matt. 16:26; I Peter 1:18-19
- 5. Wealth can only bring temporary glory. v. 16-20**

Is your greatest treasure in heaven or on earth? Matt. 6:19-21

 2. What can a person get out of this Psalm? v. 3, 4
 3. What are money and possessions unable to do for you? v. 5-8

 5. What foolish attitudes do some wealthy people have? v. 11
 6. What is your attitude toward your money and your things?
 7. What things are of far greater importance than your stuff?
Is there anything you should do differently about how you view or use your stuff? If yes, how should you change?
 8. What will be of greatest importance to you on the day of your death?
