Blessed Are Those Who Mourn

Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted. (Matthew 5:4)

Scripture Reference: Luke 6:20-23; Isaiah 53:3; Romans 7:15, 24-25, 12:15; Nehemiah 1:4; 2 Corinthians 6:10

- To 'Mourn' Inevitably Follows Being 'Poor In Spirit.' It's a life that recognizes the seriousness of the day. It is a life that is not overwhelmed by discouragement and depression, because it is a life that recognizes the true path to blessing and happiness.
- 2. To 'Mourn' Leads Us To Self-Examination Of Our Sins. When I ask myself truthfully why I do what I do, I open myself up
 to the working and moving of God, all within the backdrop of once
 again being emptied and becoming poor in spirit and mourning
 who I am.
- 3. **To 'Mourn' Leads Us To The Sins Of Others. -** As we reflect on the things we do and gain an understanding of why we do them, our hearts go out to those struggling with similar battles. And we mourn the sins of others, as we should.
- 4. To 'Mourn' Leads Us Fundamentally To Sin Itself. The Christian looks at life seriously, contemplates it spiritually, sees sin and its effects, and is broken by what they see and is immediately comforted. Happy are they that mourn, for they shall be comforted.
- Practical Application: How Can We Live This Beatitude? Practice Honest Confession; 2. Cultivate Compassionate Hearts; 3. Engage the Brokenness of the World; and
 Hold Sorrow and Joy Together.

Study Questions:

- 1. The promise of Matthew 5:4 is that mourners will be comforted. According to (Luke 2:25; Isaiah 53:3; John 11:35) how is Jesus qualified as a competent comforter?
- 2. Read Matthew 5:1–4 and Isaiah 61:1–3 together as a group. What similarities do you notice? What does this tell us?
- 3. What does it look like to have courage to truly mourn or grieve instead of hiding it?
- 4. How can we be agents of God's comfort to those around us?
