HOW TO BE VICTORIOUS IN LIFE and MINISTRY Acts 14:1-7

1. RELY ON THE LORD FOR RESULTS. V. 1-3

2. EXPECT OPPOSITION. V. 2

3. BOLDLY MINISTER, V. 3

"Therefore they spent a long time there speaking boldly with reliance upon the Lord..." v. 3 (NASB)

4. DON'T BE SURPRISED BY DIVISION. V. 4

5. TRUST THE LORD WITH YOUR LIFE. V. 5

6. REDIRECT YOU LIFE AND MINISTRY AS NECESSARY. V. 6

To keep on living and ministering Paul and Barnabas had to escape from Iconium. They had to leave a vibrant ministry, but they guickly went to another place where the gospel needed to be heard. V. 4-7

If you stop being able to serve God in one place, try another. If you are unable to minister for the Lord in one way, minister for Him in another way. The Lord is able to guide you by the Word of God, circumstances. counselors, and the Holy Spirit.

7. NEVER STOP SERVING THE LORD. V. 7

One of the great things that you can see in the life of Paul is resiliency. Paul kept serving the Lord after whippings, trials, imprisonments, persecutions and even after being stoned. When Paul got knocked down he seemed to get back up with more spiritual strength and determination than before. (see Acts 14:19, 20)

Be unstoppable when it comes to doing the will of God. By God's grace, grow stronger with each trial and tribulation.
