Blessed Are the Poor in Spirit

Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. (Matthew 5:3)

- 1. What Does "Poor in Spirit" Mean? To be poor in spirit is to stand before God and say, "I bring nothing in my hands. I cannot earn Your favor. I depend wholly on Your mercy." Being poor in spirit defines a new way to live, and it is a fundamental characteristic of a Christian. (Matthew 5:3)
- The Promise: "Theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven" If you are poor in spirit and looking to God in everything, the kingdom of heaven is yours! How do we become poor in spirit? We read and study God's Word, we starve our carnal desires, including our pride, and we ask God to be merciful to us. (Judges 7; Luke 15)
- 3. The Beatitudes Are Reflected Throughout Scripture All of the principles in the Beatitudes are also found in abundance in both the Old and New Testaments.(For example: Isaiah 66:2; Psalm 51:17; Luke 18:9-14; Romans 3:23; Ephesians 2:8; James 2:5)
- 4. **Some Warnings Against False Poverty** Not all forms of poverty of spirit are genuine. We must beware of and avoid false humility and despair. (2 Corinthians 7:10)
- Practical Applications of Being Poor in Spirit: How can we live poor in spirit?
 Humility in Prayer (Matthew 6:11)
 Dependence on God's Word (Matthew 4:4)
 Gentleness Toward Others (Philippians 2:3)
 Freedom from Self-Reliance (Psalm 127:1)

- 1. What implications does a proper understanding of spiritual poverty have in connection with salvation and sanctification?
- 2. Author and pastor Kent Hughes has written, "The more spiritually mature we become, the more profound will be our sense of poverty." Do you agree or disagree with that statement and why?
- 3. What are some enemies of being poor in spirit? Where are such things seen in cultural trends today, or even in your own life?
- 4. What does "for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" mean? What does the kingdom of Heaven look like?
