HOW TO DEAL WITH DISAGREEMENTS with Believers

Insights on the Disagreement between Paul and Barnabas Acts 15:35-41

1. Focus on doing the will of God and pleasing Him. V. 36

2. Remember that the other believer thinks they are right too. V. 37, 38

3. Consider the possibility that you may be the one who is wrong. V. 38 Paul said the following at a later time. "Only Luke is with me. Take Mark, and bring him with you: for he is profitable to me for the ministry." 2 Tim. 4:11

4. Recognize that some disagreements are not easily resolved, if at all. V. 39

Acknowledge that if someone disagrees with you, it is not necessarily a sign of ungodliness on their part. V. 39
Both Paul and Barnabas loved God and wanted to do His will.

6. Try not to let disagreements ruin your relationships.

7. Don't let disagreements or contentions keep you from serving God. V. 39-41

Always pray and ask for God's guidance when trying to resolve disagreements. God sometimes resolves what seem to be irresolvable conflicts.
